
Dear Students,

As we approach the end of Spring Break, the UF International Center would like to provide some travel information as it relates to recent COVID-19 Updates.

- Please find all official UF communications and updates archived here: <u>http://www.ufl.edu/health-updates/;</u> The University will continue to provide updates. Please continue to monitor your Gatorlink accounts.
 - Exchange Students: Your home universities may also be providing updates. You are encouraged to monitor both channels of communication.
- **Domestic Travel** over Spring Break: As a reminder, you are not required to present immigration documents for travel within the US. It is recommended that you carry these documents with you for out-of-state or extended travel: valid passport, valid I-20 or DS-2019 form.
- International Travel over Spring Break:
 - If you have left the US during the Spring Break period, re-entry will require presentation of your valid passport, valid I-20 or DS-2019 form with travel validation, valid visa (exempt for travel under automatic revalidation).
 - <u>Federal Policy:</u> The Department of State is communicating updates related to reentry into the US and COVID-19 on their website via an announcement banner: <u>https://travel.state.gov/content/travel.html</u>(Click banner for more information).
 - Re-entry into the US is currently **only** restricted for international visitors that have traveled to China within the last 14 days. Be prepared to show recent travel history via airline/transport tickets, <u>I-94 record/travel history</u>, etc.
 - <u>University Policy:</u> Per University Guidelines "Based on guidance from the State Surgeon General and the Board of Governors, all students and employees returning from China, Iran, Italy, Japan, and South Korea need to self-quarantine and not return to campus for fourteen days after their return. In addition, UF has cancelled all university travel to those countries. Students who need to selfquarantine should contact the Dean of Students office at <u>umatter@ufl.edu</u>".

The UF International Center will continue to provide guidance as it relates to maintenance of your student visa status. You are encouraged to utilize the above-mentioned resources and continue monitoring for updates.
