Dear Visitors,

We hope this email finds you well.

In light of the June 22 <u>presidential proclamation</u>, EVS would like to provide an explanation of new visa restrictions and how they may affect the J-1 visa holders and the international community at UF.

Of all J-1 visa categories sponsored by UF, **only student interns** are affected by these updated restrictions. Incoming student interns will be unable to join us for the Summer or Fall 2020 semesters, and the restrictions will be in effect from **June 24, 2020** to **December 31, 2020**.

**Student Interns:** Your visa status is affected. You may remain in the U.S. and actively pursue your program activities to the end of your current J-1 program, as outlined on your DS-2019.

- What do I need to do right now?

  - Watch your inbox for another, more detailed message from Luis.
- Does this mean my visa/program are canceled?
  - No. Your current J-1 visa and program are still active and valid, but you may be affected by other restrictions.
- Can I travel outside the U.S.?
  - No. You cannot leave and re-enter the U.S. with a J-1 student intern visa, regardless of the travel dates or purpose.

**Research Scholars, Short-Term Scholars, Professors, Degree-Seeking Students, Non-Degree Students:** Nothing has changed. Your visa status is not affected and you may continue your program activities as normal.
